## **Seattle Rises to Confront Fascism - ICE Out Rally and March, Cal Anderson Park, 3-28**

**SEATTLE** – On Saturday, March 28, Seattle will rise to join in the largest nationwide mass mobilization yet to stop the fascism and corruption of the Trump regime.

*“Trump’s MAGA regime is starting to crack,” said Kathleen Carson, Seattle Indivisible president and co-lead of the No Kings Seattle Coalition. “He’s losing in court on multiple fronts and his illegal war is wildly unpopular. As public defiance grows, the Trump administration is ramping up its cruelty - but the people continue to demonstrate that neighbors supporting neighbors is one of our strongest forms of resistance.”*

Seattle will rally at Cal Anderson Park on Capitol Hill, with music starting at 11:45 and speakers about noon. Following the speakers, the group will march to Seattle Center International Fountain, where they can find organizers from the more than 40 coalition partners and endorsers as well as connect with their local neighborhood activist teams.

Pastor Sergio Amezcua, a leading figure in the Minneapolis resistance, will be the keynote speaker. He is the senior pastor at Dios Habla Hoy, a bilingual church in south Minneapolis, where he leads a solidarity operation with 4,000 volunteers that feeds 16,000 families in the face of assault by federal authorities. Washington Attorney General Nick Brown will be the rally’s leadoff speaker. Charles Douglas, executive director of Common Power, will MC the rally.

Ken Workman, Duwamish Tribe elder, will give a land acknowledgement. Local artists King Youngblood and The Wanz will bring music to the rally.

One of the lessons from Minneapolis is that block by block organizing is key to resistance, Carson said. No Kings organizers in Seattle are working to hyper-charge local organizing efforts, supporting neighborhood efforts with tools and trainings.

*“Neighbor by neighbor, block by block, community by community, we are building the firewall against dictatorship,” Carson said.. “Find your neighbors, get to know them and come together to say NO to this regime. No Kings Seattle is neighbors fighting fascism.”*

Additional speakers at Cal Anderson include Michael McPhearson, executive director of Veterans for Peace, Aretha Basu and Chrissy Shimizu from Puget Sound Sage, Jessa Davis from the Seattle LGBTQ Commission, Pia Rivera-Jones of the People’s Organizing Center at MLK Labor, and Shemona Moreno from 350 Seattle.

**More than 3,000 events are planned around the country on March 28, the national No Kings Coalition announced. Join our peaceful Seattle protest on March 28.** Bring your friends and neighbors. Afterwards, find your neighborhood activist team at Seattle Center to continue to make a difference and protect our communities.
